Design and Technology	Your child will use junk modelling materials to create various models. They are learning how to use glue
	and sellotape to stick things together and to use scissors carefully.
Music	Your child sings with their class every day. We are learning lots of new songs but we will be spending a
	lot of time working on the days of the week and numbers to support their maths knowledge. We will also
	be introducing the names of instruments and give the children a chance to explore the sounds they make.
