Our focus today will be on Phonics

What is Sounds Write?



- Sounds Write is a scheme to teach children how to read and write successfully.
- Your children have been immersed in this way of learning since nursery.
- An age-appropriate child will know all their single letter sounds
 a, b, c, d, e, f, g, h, i, j, k, l, m, n, o, p, , r, s, t, u, v, w, x, y, z
- They also know all double consonants e.g. ll, ff, tt



Blending and segmenting

- Blending is a skill that pushes the sounds together to build a word and this skill tends to be used more in reading. To support the children with this we would say: "Say the sounds and read the word".
- Segmenting is the ability to pull sounds apart and this skill tends to be used more in writing. "What is the first sound you can hear in the word ____".

Building on this learning all children are now working on recognising that the same sound can be represented in different ways. e.g. e, ea, ee, y

When supporting your child to select the correct representation it is important that we do not say it's the e a as our children have not yet been taught letter names.



Same spelling, different sound

Moving forward the children are soon going to be learning that one spelling can represent more than one sound. E.g. ea, ea

great

If a child reads a word by pronouncing the incorrect sound just let them know... 'In this word, this (point to digraph) represents...'



Phonics Screening

So, Frog and Toad went to Crow's home to take him a bunch of roses and say hello.


