




Year 2 age related expectations - writing

- write simple, coherent narratives about personal experiences and those of others (real or fictional)
- write about real events, recording these simply and clearly
- write most sentences with capital letters and full stops, and use question marks correctly when required
- use present and past tense mostly correctly and consistently
- use co-ordination (such as or/and/but) and some subordination (such as when/if/that/because) to join clauses
- spell many common exception words
- form capital letters and digits of the correct size, orientation and relationship to one another and to lower-case letters
 - use spacing between words that reflects the size of the letters



How we form our numbers at Floreat Wandsworth Primary School:




