








We believe learning isn't an event It must be knowledge-rich vocabulary-rich skilful




**Sequence matters** systematically planned explicit instruction supports acquisition of curriculum content

Let's look at two key skills.

### Vocabulary Building

Every CUSP lesson that we do starts with unpicking vocabulary

Which words may they find difficult?



#### **Vocabulary Building**

To secure the word beckoned into their internal dictionary ready to be used again, they must do these three steps for new vocabulary.

- Decode
- Define
- Contextualise

beck/oned


To invite someone closer

Key vocabulary:

rafters

raf/ters

Definition: a bit of wood that goes across the roof to hold it up

Context: The rafters go across my bedroom ceiling

Key vocabulary:

# tiresome

tire/some

Definition: feeling bored or annoyed

Context: Taking down the laundry when it is dry is tiresome.

Key vocabulary:

vanishing

van/i/shing

Definition: something disappearing

Context: My pencil keeps vanishing!
